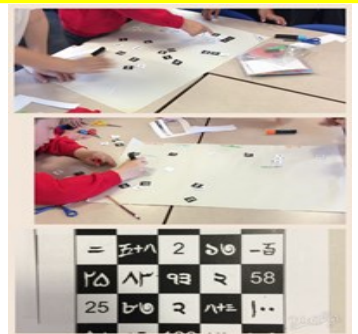
Y5
