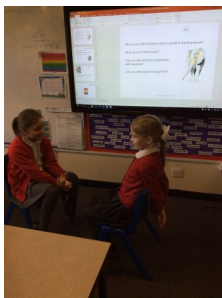


This week we have been making our own dinosaur footprints! We painted some with our own feet and even drew some outside on the big chalk board!
