

Maths:

Fractions

- Compare and order fractions whose denominators are multiples of the same number.
- Identify, name and write equivalent fractions of a given fraction.
- Recognise mixed number and improper fractions and convert from one form to the other.
- Add and subtract fractions.
- Multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers.
- Read and write decimal numbers as fractions.

Decimals

- Read, write, order and compare numbers with up to three decimal places.
- Recognise and use thousandths and relate them to tenths, hundredths and decimal equivalents.
 - Round decimals with two decimal places.
 - Solve problems involving number up to three decimal places.

Percentages

- Recognise the per cent symbol and understand that per cent related to 'number of parts per hundred', and write percentages as a fraction with denominator 100.
- Solve problems which require knowing percentage and decimal equivalents.

Science:

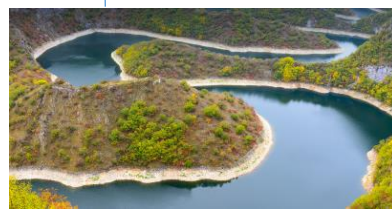
Our topic for science this half term is forces. We will be planning fair investigations, carrying out fair investigations, collating results and developing scientific conclusions. Some of our investigations will include friction, levers and pulleys and upthrust.

Topic:

As part of our topic, we will be learning about the artist Monet and recreating his wonderful artwork, which features impressions of water.
