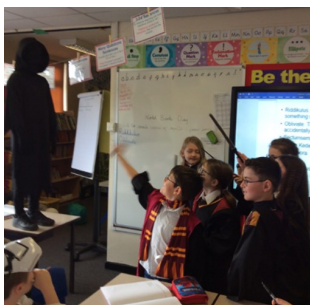


Y6W
