This week the children in Year 1 have worked really hard on finding halves and quarters of shapes and quantities. Here they are problem solving using their bar models and equipment.

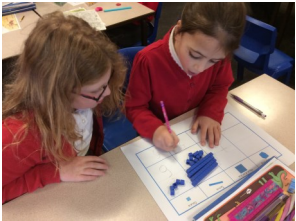
Y3/4
